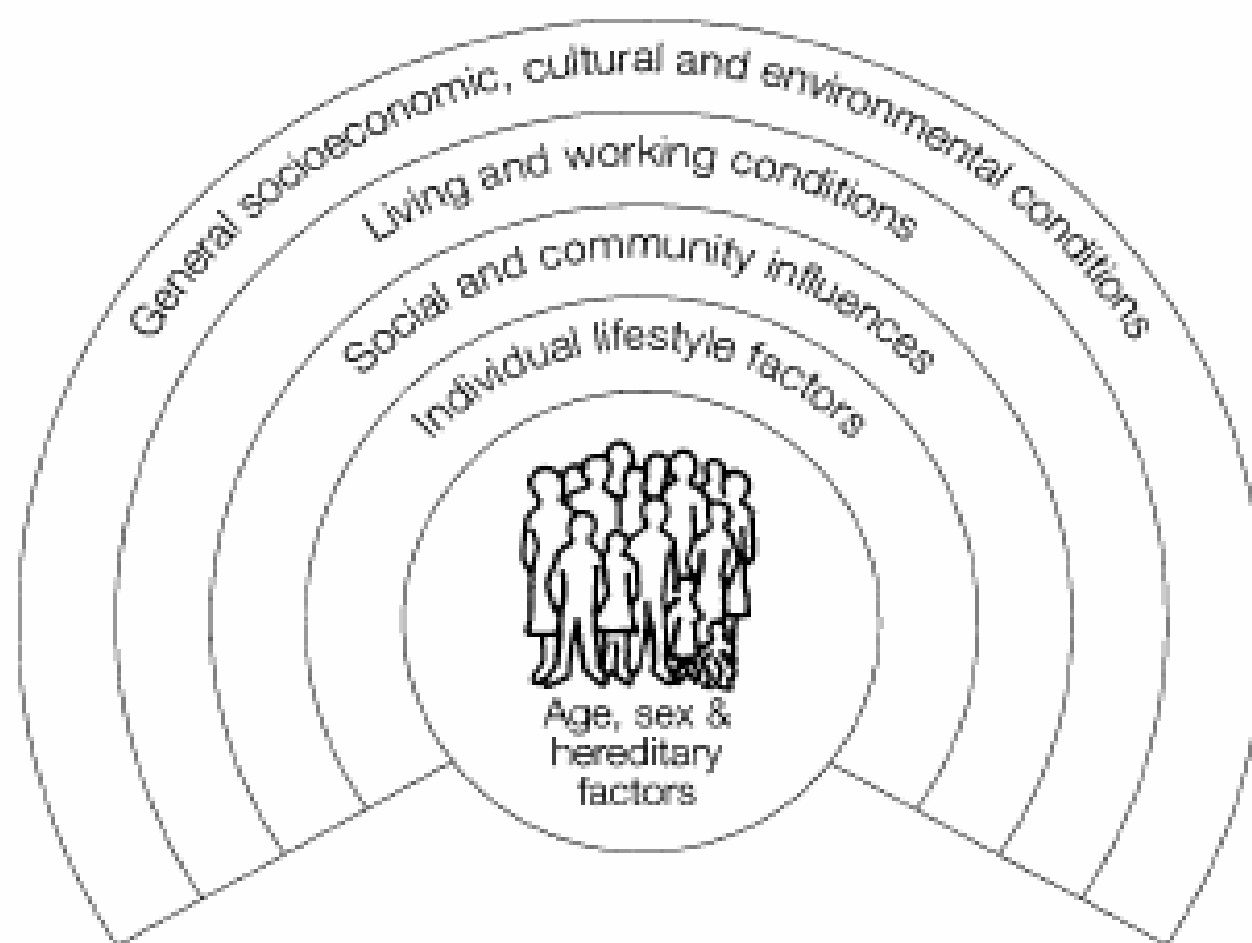
## Public Health Advisory Committee Te Rōpū Tohutohu i te Hauora Tūmatanui

- Established under legislation
- Sub-group of the NHC
- Required to give independent advice to the Minister on “public health issues, including factors underlying the health of people & communities”

# What is public health?

- “The science & art of preventing disease, prolonging life & promoting health through the organised efforts of society”
- Concerned with health outcomes, patterns of determinants, & policies

- New Zealand Health Strategy objective
- Interest in transport & health

- Guide to HIA
- Case study on transport & health – including background papers
- Conclusions on HIA & its future use



# HIA case study using public transport policy

- Selecting the policy – review of public transport funding
- Approach to cross-sectoral work – informal collaboration
- Case study included 3 trials



# Outcomes of trialling

- Refinements to the Guide to HIA
- Submission to Transfund
- Key lessons – communication, understanding of policy outcomes & public health concepts

## Where to next?

- Wide distribution of Guide to HIA
- Question of how to facilitate use of HIA across government

# Facilitating use of HIA

- Application of HIA should happen incrementally
- HIA should be built into the routines of govt policy-making
- Need to increase capacity & expertise across government

# Challenges

- Funding & capacity-building – whose responsibility?
- Need for evaluation of HIA
- Crossover with other impact assessments
- Avoiding ‘health fascist’ criticisms

# Opportunities

- Political climate is conducive
  - ✓ Sustainable development
  - ✓ Social reporting
  - ✓ ‘Whole of government’ thinking
  - ✓ Local government’s broader mandate
  - ✓ NZHS & proposed Public Health Bill
